OSPREY, SWAN RIVER CENSUS

It will be good to see how many Osprey breed along the Swan River. In 2009

there were 4 active nests.

What is the current status? It is for that purpose I would like to ask anyone who sees an Osprey building or sitting on a nest, raising chicks etc. to please report the details to me.

There are a number of nest sites around the Swan River some active, some not, some in progress.

There also some breeding poles around the river.

Known sites are: Salter Point, Mt Henry, Aquinas; Claremont, Peppermint Grove, Devil's Elbow; Old Swan Brewery, Riverside Drive; Radio mast, Garrett Road Bridge, Ascot Waters; Ron Courtney Island, Garvey Park, Ascot; Alfred Cove; Pelican Point, Nedlands; Comer Street overpass, Como. There are bound to be others.

Though the Swan River is the focus of the census, I am happy to receive information on Osprey nests within the wider Metro area, coast line.
